A delegation of two Georgetown women brought their concerns regarding the Child Exploitation Act, Bill C-53, to Halton board of education trustees Thursday night, asking for their support in hastening MPs to make it law.

"It is no longer strangers with candy who are approaching our children," said Barbara Johnson, a member of Citizens Against Violent Pornography. "Molesters frequently take pictures of their child victims and that's where marketing of pornography begins.


