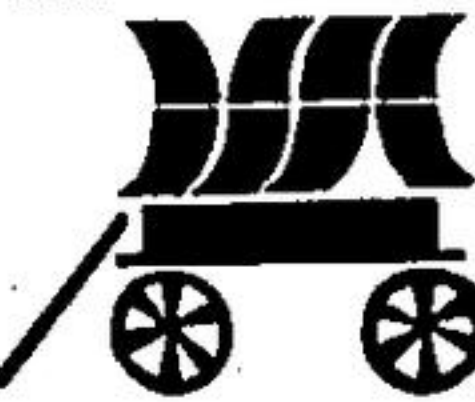
Pioneer Days is coming June 16, 17 and 18 and the event is shaping up to be the best ever, thanks to support from a variety of community groups and individuals.
