Local ponds now stocked

Many thanks to those dozens of people who have asked about my stolen tackle box. I really appreciate that you care. It still has not turned up but I did not expect it would. Being such an unusual type of tackle box, it will always be recognizable even though the name and address is removed from the Inside. The hard part now will be getting the money together to replace all the items inside; at least the ones that can still be purchased. It is embarrassing borrowing lures when I am out fishing with friends.

Penetanguishene, the outdoorsman's paradise?? It sure seems that way. On a recent trip to Penetang' we fished for crappie, stream trout and hunted for delicious morrells, those delectable mushrooms of spring. Rainbow trout are taken there as are the occasional salmon. The local people take to the woods for such delicacies as fiddle heads, crinkle root, wild leeks (onions) and anything else that grows wild. My thanks to Mr. Howse for his hospitality while at his marina.

Terra Cotta Conservation Area is now stocked, as is Belfountain. The trout are never large when first stocked but the two and three pounders taken there at the first of the season are "left overs" from previous stockings. With the late stocking this year, and the fact they had almost a week to acclimatize before they were fished much, means there will be many fish left over for next spring, as there was this year. Please remember that there is a three fish limit, and don't abuse the privilege of free admission.

Walleye fishing is of to a good start. Once again, depending on where and how you fish, the fishing has been good to excellent. As always, some people phone up and tell me the walleye fishing was poor, but not every fishing spot is hot at the same time.

When things are slow, try fishing at night, especially after midnight. Fish slower and deeper. Many times fishermen don't get deep enough for walleye. The use of a Gapen Balt Walker will get any lure or bait down to the gold fields. A bait walker is a "V" shaped wire with a weight on one end, and a swivel on the other. The line is attached to the centre of the "V" and the weight bounces off logs and rocks to make it almost snag proof. The lure or bait can be run at various distances from the terminal rig and the bait walker is very effective with a floating Rapala. The lure rides up over the weed tops or bottom obstruction and is in the feed


