"The calls that are the most satisfying for us are those with a specific problem, say from someone in a particularly stressful situation who needs someone to talk with," Rev. Ridley said.

some kind of solution is reached or the caller hangs up feeling better. Such experiences make volunteers feel useful in that they were able to help someone through a crisis situation, Rev. Rid-

ley said. Confidential, the service is run by about 60 volunteers, and is open 24

hours a day to anyone in

Of course, the Centre also has regulars, people who call every day, several times a week, or once a weck.

"They become the friends of the Centre and most of the volunteers know who they are," Rev. Ridley said.

He sald not many youths call the Centre, at least not as many as the organization would like.

"Maybe they feel we are 'establishment','' Rev. Ridley said.

He pointed out volunteers who man the phones range in age from 20 to 70, so the service isn't just for older people. There are young volunteers as well for callers to confide in and relate to with their troubles.

"You get people who almost feel ashamed to be calling," Rev. Ridley said, "They say, 'I haven'i got a big problem...' They think it's just the number to call if you're contemplating suicide."

Volunteers reassure such callers that they don't have to be at their rope's end before they call 877-1211.

Callers are often referred to various social agencies by volunteers. Sometimes they specifically phone for an agency's number, Mr. Ridley
