

Flag football season makes for a summer of fierce competition

When the U.S.F.L. scheduled their season to avoid direct competition with the National Football League they made a critical oversight by overlapping with the Georgetown Flag Football League season. Anyone with a finger on the pulse of North American sports knows that once the beef-cakes in the shorts take the field this Sunday it will be tough going for the new league.

Season seven finds the GFFL with a new two-division format that will feature the Greeks, Dairy Queen, Lindsay's Longhorns, Fobert Real Estate and the league's newest entry, Independent Appraising, on one side, and Delrex Smoke Shop, M and M Pro Sports, North Halton Sports, Corrigan Instruments and T and R Paving on the other. The names of some teams have changed but few of the faces have.

In case you were wondering what became of the Village People, they enrolled in the Blanche Dubois School of Journalism and produced their first piece two weeks ago in a port on the "awesome" league champion Greeks. Apparently the Greeks will be even more wonderful this year than last. Now, if they could only find their trophy.

Dairy Queen promises to be the major threat to knocking off the Greeks, having required much travelled quarterback Mitch Leblanc to go with a five group of receivers and a reshuffled defense. Until last year when they lost Leblanc temporarily, DQ had virtually owned the Greeks and are confident the magic is back.

Lindsay's Longhorns, once known as Mountainview Plaza, return this year on a crest of optimism born of the signing of quarterback prospect Mike McCandless. If they attain any kind of consistency they should push hard for second place in the division.

Fobert Real Estate, rather than adding to their lineup have actually cut from it and will likely remain a good team, but not a serious threat to win their division.

If the new Independent Appraising team can make as much noise on the field as they did getting off the ground they should be dynamite. Indications are they have some reasonable talent but time will tell if they can put it together.

The other division finds Delrex as the only team where the twenty-eight year olds refer to their team mates as "Sir", out of respect for their elders. Taking them lightly however, is like petting a shark because they still have enough firepower to blow most defenses out of the water.

M and M Sports have two things to overcome if they intend to make waves. First they have to find a new quarterback, since Mitch Leblanc jumped ship. They also

have to overcome their label as playoff chokers. M and M are always one of the league's toughest regular season teams and

should be in the hunt for top spot. North Halton Sports is even older than Smoke Shop and word out of their

camp is that they plan to score at least once a game and hope the defense can hold on. Corrigan Instruments,

headed by Paul Larose, lost key players when John Larose went to the Greeks and Riv Kennedy headed over to the expansion

side. The result is a roster with some critical holes to fill if they are to avoid another long season.

You have to feel sorry for T and R Paving who have shed their old name Norval Arcade, in hopes that they can become

something other than a training squad for other teams. Every time they develop a good player he takes it on the lam the

next year. Nine rookies mean another tough year for this team. The new season kicks off at 9 a.m. Sunday.
