Mr. Griffin is not entirely new to the local art scene. In the last two juried art shows at the Brampton Museum and Art Gallery his work was featured and he also exhibited his art in the Carling-O'Keefe Festival of the Arts in 1961.

No one is more surprised at his talents than Mr. Griffin himself. He used to be a dispatcher for Bochmers Trucking and would find he was still tense after a day's work.
