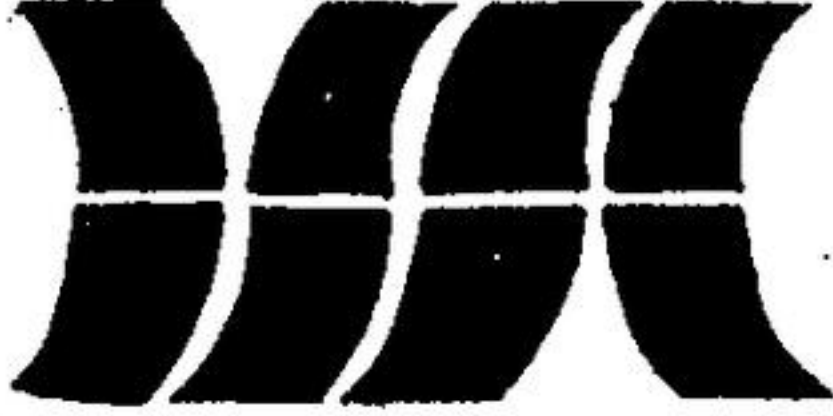


## Thank you time

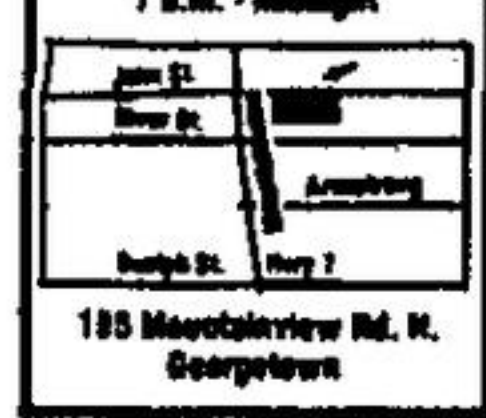

## Hill stars in 'The Entertainer'

Georgetown's Ron Hill stars in John Osborne's "The Entertainer" which opened in Toronto Friday night.

A veteran Georgetown Little Theatre actor, Mr. Hill plays Archie Rice, the lead role. The Entertainer is being produced by York Centennial Theatre as part of their summer repertory season and runs Tuesday through Saturday nights until July 9.

The play is a bitter-sweet comedy which centres on the demise of vaudeville. Mr. Hill told The Herald.

Through song and dance scenes, the audience takes a look at Archie's colorful life. The production is directed and designed by Donald H. Ford. Mr. Ford was a guest director in GLT's "No Sex Please, We're British" several years ago. (The play was written by "Not Now Darling" author Roy Cooney.)

Mr. Hill said the play was originally written for Sir Laurence Olivier who starred in stage versions in London and on Broadway, as well as film version.

Archie's role was recently handled on film by Jack Lemmon.
