The Georgettes scored in five of seven at bats to snap their mini-tailspin, and raise their record to six wins against eight losses. That mark is good enough for fourth place in the seven-team loop.

The locals struck for a pair in their first at bat. Becky Halonen led off with a double, but she was gunned down at the plate

when Marion McGugan doubled.

Jennifer Reynolds reached on an error, and McGugan scored on the play. Maureen Brown then delivered Reynolds with a two-base hit.

The Georgettes upped the count to 6-0 by the fifth inning, then salted the win away with a three run rally in the sixth.

Bonnie Penney singled to lead off the inning, and she scored on Reynolds' double. Brown drew a free pass, and Janet MacKay unloaded a two-run double.
