Raise to \$73,500

A five per cent raise for Halton board of education director Wally Beevor was unanimously approved July 7 by trustees, hiking his salary from \$70,000 to \$73,500. The raise is retroactive to Nov. 16, 1982. Trustees also approved a further raise to \$77,000, effective Nov. 16 this year until July 1, 1984.

Mr. Beevor had declined a salary raise last year, Halton Hills trustee Betty Fisher noted.

"I know other directors of neighboring boards are making \$80,000," she said.
