The way the Centre is currently being used, Mrs. Alexander mainlained, contributes to the decline of arable land in Ontario, a decline of about 12.5 acres an hour.

Because of zoning regulations on the space between farm bulldings and the nearest dwelling on adjacent properties, Mrs. Alexander says the Croatian Centre inhibits potential expansion of the famlly farm.

In one graph, the finance committee chairman notes that equalization factors - expressed as a percentage and being the ratio of assessed value to market value of homes -- between Georgetown and Acton have narrowed since 1979 when there was about a one point spread between the two communities.

Now, he says, there is only a fractional difference and changes in taxation should reflect this.

While he did not blame the treasury department for the differences. stressing that assessment is a provincial concern, Coun. Knechtel said he wanted comments from treasurer Ray King.




