

Private Property Week

The Town of Halton Hills has proclaimed Oct. 2-10 as Private Property Week in the Town, it was announced this week.

"We in the real estate industry believe that private property rights are among the most basic and precious of freedoms," Al Bissell, president of the Brampton Real Estate Board said. "Yet, if we are not aware of our rights and the fact that they are slowly drifting away from us, we could lose them all together."

Private Property Week is being celebrated throughout Ontario, sponsored by the Ontario Real Estate Association and its 48 member real estate boards.

Mr. Bissell said the general public is cordially invited to attend an Open House and to join in the celebration of freedoms. Hot dogs and soft drinks will be served and a band will supply the entertainment Wednesday, Oct. 5, 6 p.m. to 9 p.m., 119 West Drive, Brampton.

The Proclamation by Mayor Peter Pomeroy reads:

WHEREAS, The Brampton Real Estate Board and the Ontario Real Estate Association have selected the theme "Preserving the Spirit of Our Land" in conjunction with their Private Property Week, being celebrated from October 2-10, 1983, and

WHEREAS, the microcosm of our free enterprise system is perhaps best demonstrated in the right each of us has to own real property. This is a right secured by our colonial forefathers and passed down to us as a heritage of freedom... a heritage that has helped us to make this country

great, and

WHEREAS, during this special time, it is important for each of us to recognize that we sometimes take the land for granted. The beautiful lakes and streams that provide us summer and winter pleasures; the mountains that stand the test of time as mementos from our Supreme Creator; the woods that provide a year-long playground clothed in an extravaganza of always-changing colour. All these things we look at as our due, our heritage, and

WHEREAS, the bounties of the land, while they offer what seems to be limitless enjoyment for every member of the family, must not be taken for granted. We must learn to preserve the land; we must learn to nurture it, protect it, develop it, and watch it grow. For without a planned effort at preservation of the land, we may see in this country a deterioration of the land and a deterioration of citizens' rights to own the land.

NOW, THEREFORE, I Mayor of the Town of Halton Hills, do hereby proclaim October 2-10, 1983, as "Private Property Week", a week dedicated to reaffirming our right not only to real property, but also to call attention to our duty to preserve the land and our inalienable right to enjoy that land. 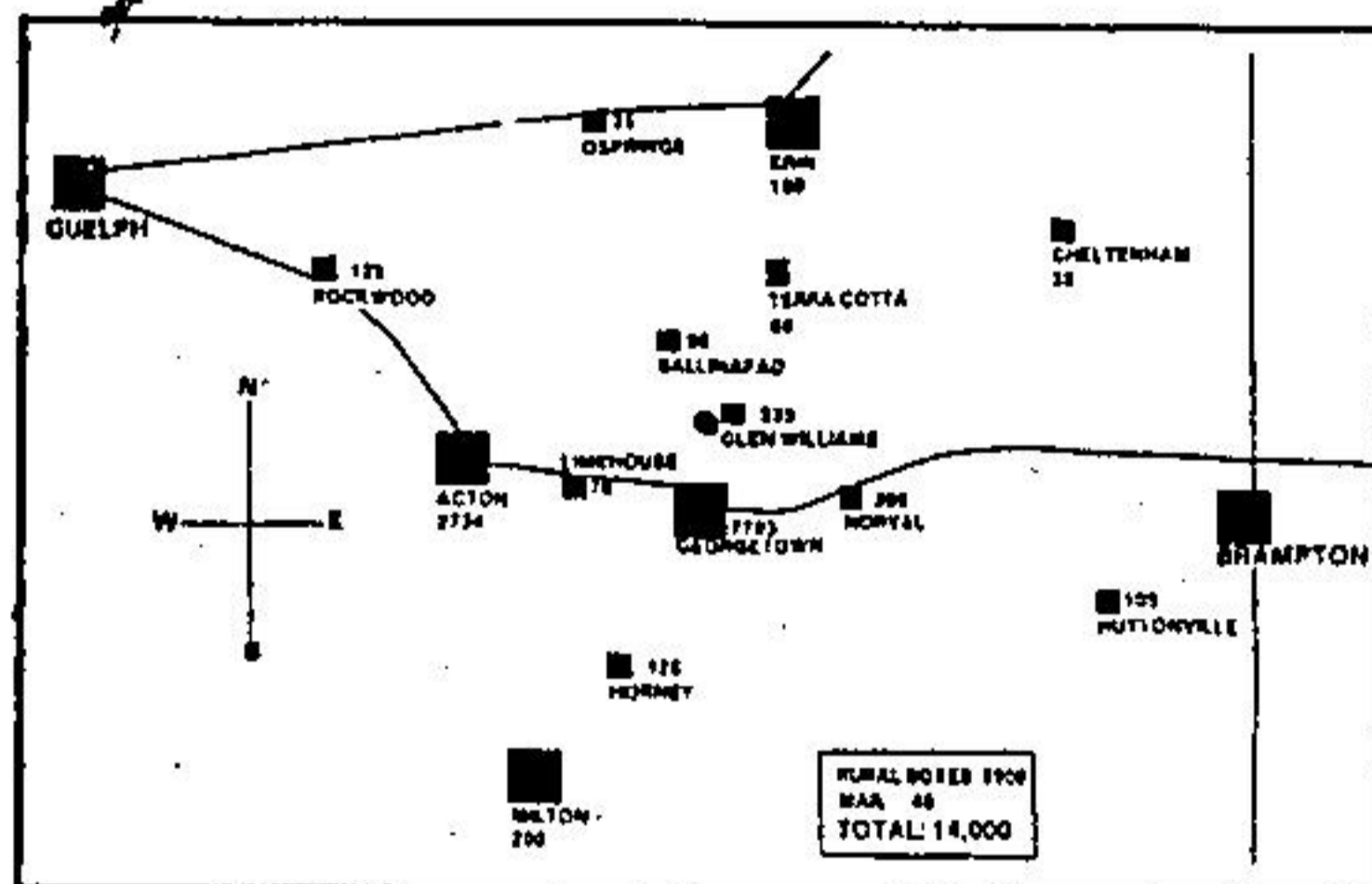
