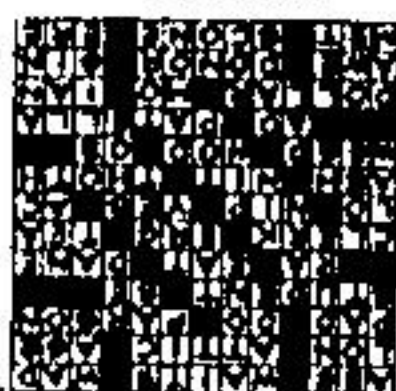
A large variety of sporting and working dog breeds, representing retrievers, pointers, setters, trackers and sled dog breeds, will

The club name was then decided. The leaders introduced us to our two guests, Maris and

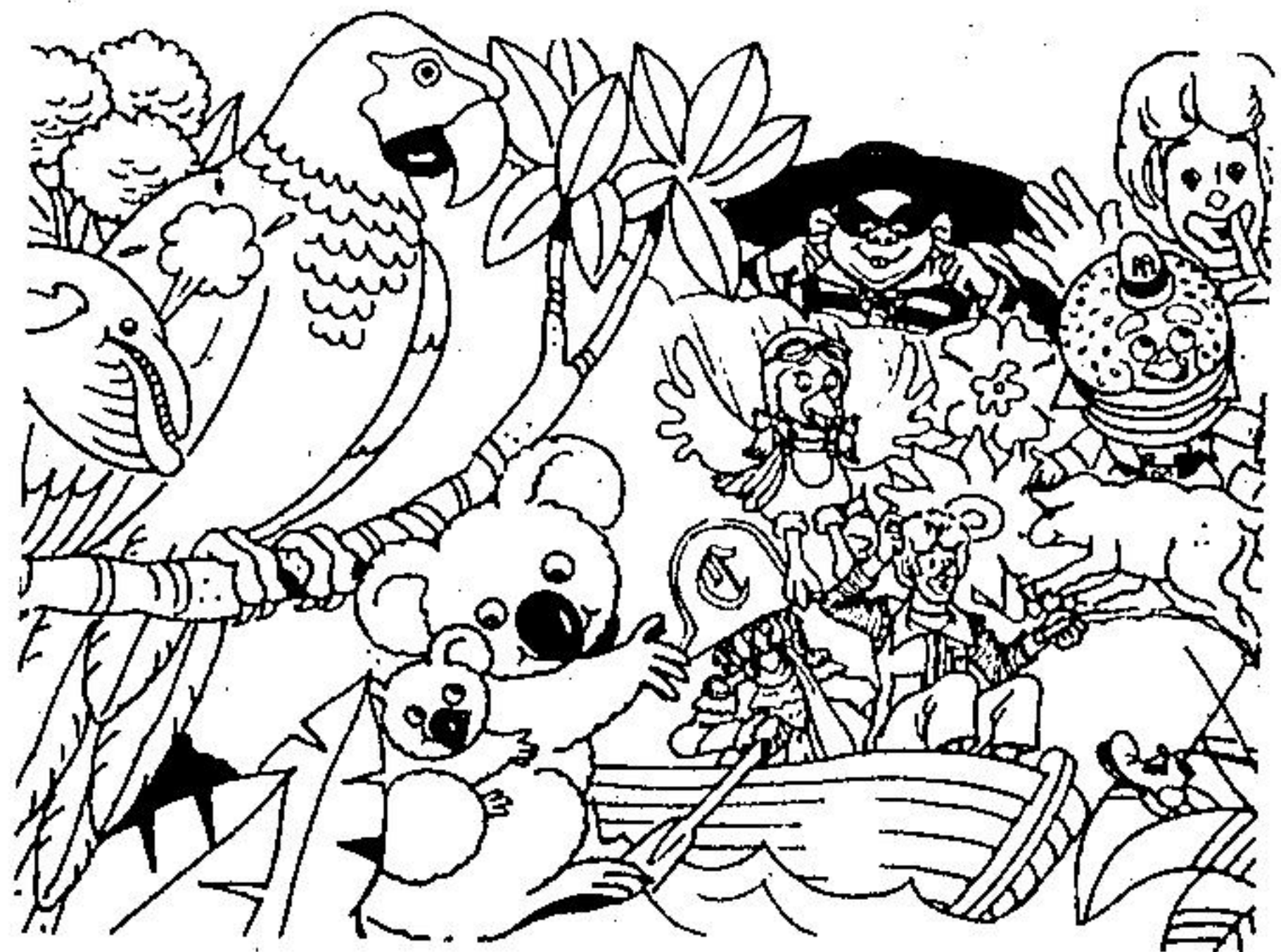
Heather Davis, who demonstrated techniques
