## Pro Sports upset Norval 6-5 Raiders cuff Sitting Bull

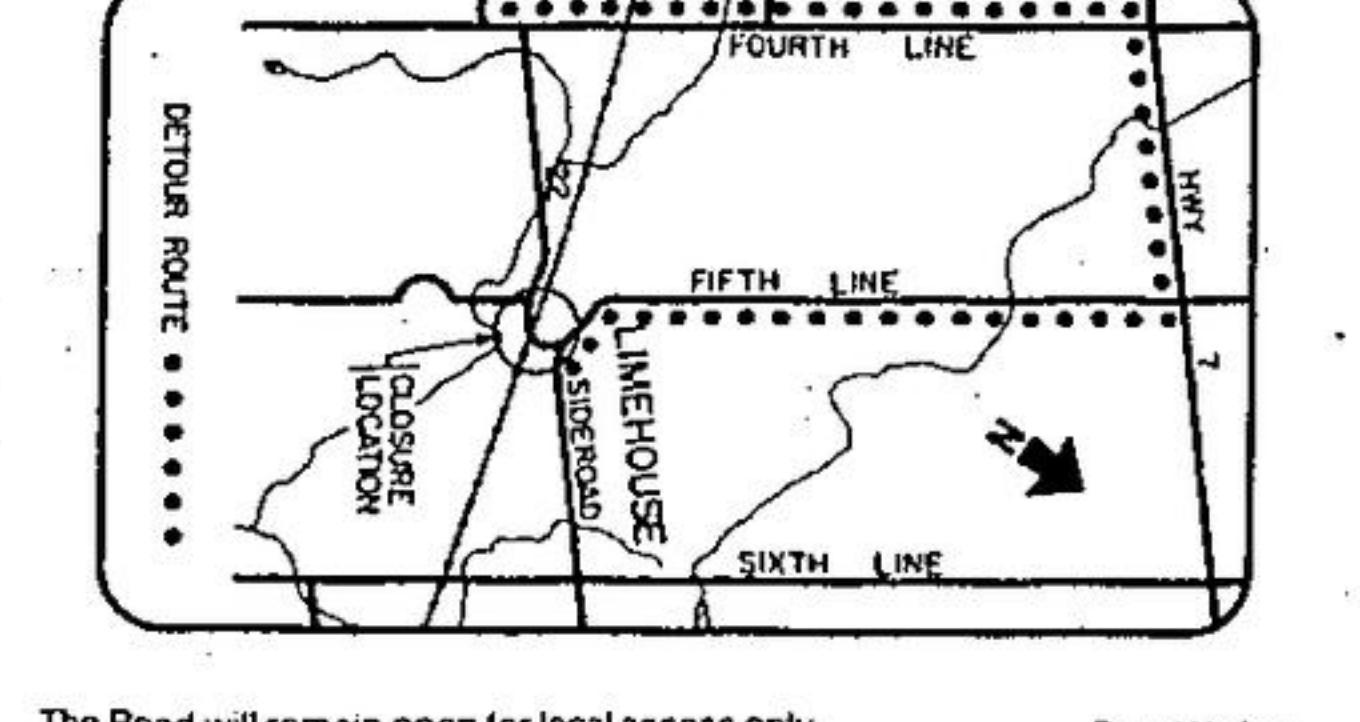
## NOTICE OF TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE
