## Christmas Seals campaign

The Halton Lung Association officially begins its Christmas Seal Campaign Nov. 1 with the mailing of Christmas Seals to some 18,000 homes in the Halton area.

Since 1927 Lung Associations across Canada have used "the Christmas Seal" as their sole method of raising funds to provide the programs and services, within their own communities, to combat lung disease.

These programs are offered free of charge to the people of Halton.

In Halton, programs include family asthma programs, smoking withdrawal clinics, better breathing clubs, lung function testing in industry, health education and smoking awareness programs in schools and the community, seminars dealing with respiratory disease and social assistance for people suffering from chronic respiratory disease.

### Surprised

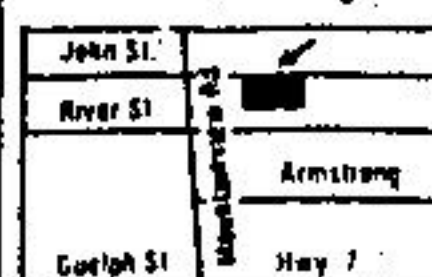
