# Cancer workers surpass goal

The Georgetown Cancer Society has surpassed their 1982-83 fundraising objective of \$37,000 by \$21,677 and landed the distinction of raising the third highest funds of all the cancer units in the province.

Campaign chairman Bill McNally has attributed the success of local cancer volunteers to their enthusiasm and to the generosity of the community.

The \$58,677 total was' raised through the annual fund raising by canvassers, daffodil chairmen and breakfast workers: through In Memorium contributions and special events like the Bill Smith Golf Tournament.

The monies that have been collected are used in part to help local cancer patients and their families.

TRIPS During the year, 623 patient trips were provided to Toronto cancer treatment centres by 17 volunteer drivers who, together, logged over 17,000 miles, under the organizational direction of volunteer Cynthia Green.


tion, Mr. Heaton said. "I don't think the town's quite ready for it, not with the water problems it has in other parts, of town," he commented.
