Video store owners buy from film distributors that supply across the nation and are generally located in the big cities. Because shop owners can't sit down and watch every movie that comes into their store, they depend on distributors to do the cutting that complies with federal law, Mrs. Patcheson said.

"If I had to sit down and watch every movie that came into my store, I'd be cross eyed," she said. "You just couldn't possibly keep up with it. You trust the distributors are monitoring them as they're making them for distribution."

QUESTIONABLE Leery of putting out questionable films, some distributors cut down on their supply over the summer, Mrs. Patcheson noted. And some cassettes came with the OCB sticker on it, indicating they had been approved.

"We've been careful in what we've been buying and I feel we've done as much as we could, with the information we've had, to comply with the guidelines," she said.

Randy Humeniski, coowner of the Acton and Georgetown H and H Video shops refused to comment on whether he thinks the OCB should censor video films.


