Top Woodstock and Kitchener

Optis in tourney final

Participating in their first tournament of the year, the Georgetown Optimist minor peewees travelled to Woodstock on the weekend.

First they topped the hosting Woodstock Police Association minor peewee team, to send them into the Championship Division with a 3-1 win. This was a penalty riddled game with both teams racking up 32 minutes in this match. Georgetown's Bill MacDonald counted first at the 7:07 mark of the second frame, deflecting a high shot from defenceman Mike McElroy from the blue line. Taking a two goal lead Wes McCauley made a nice deke after breaking around the Woodstock defence, assisted by Rod Pasma. Less than a minute later Woodstock counted their lone marker.

McCauley again counted for Georgetown at

the 5:55 mark from Mark Lortio and MacDonald to put away the 3-1 victory. Chris Cambouris and Richard Rivard shared the net minding duties for this first game for Georgetown.

In a do-or-die situation Georgetown's second match was played Sunday, against the Kitchener Crusaders (this team defeated these boys as major atoms to win the Ontario Zone Championship). The team certainly was up for the challenge, defeating Kitchener 2-1 in sudden death overtime.

The first period remained scoreless although Georgetown dominated the play with plenty of shots on net. With only 1:01 left to play in the second period Kitchener was awarded a penalty shot and they took a 1-0 lead. Again Georgetown dominated the play in this frame but just couldn't beat the stubborn Kitchener goaltending.

Andy Pearce put Georgetown back in the game with 2:58 remaining in the final stanza when he blasted a shot past the Kitchener netminder, after linemates Dale McNiven and Mike Melville had brought the puck around the net from behind.

In sudden death overtime, Lortio finally broke through the green machine defence, assisted by McCauley and MacDonald to win this game 2-1 and send Georgetown into the Championship final round against Markham. Cambouris played a strong game in net for Georgetown.

Playing against Markham for the Championship, a somewhat flat Georgetown squad was defeated 6-4 but not before a third period comeback. Markham lead 1-0 at the end of the first frame. Markham counted again early in the second stanza before Georgetown's Lortio scored on a nice deke, assisted by McCauley and MacDonald. Markham then added two more goals to lead the game 4-1.

At 6:47 of the third frame Pearce fed a puck back to the blue line from a faceoff where McElroy blasted a high shot past the

Markham goalie. Markham came back with goal number five against a short-handed Georgetown team.

Georgetown then pulled the goalie and with an extra attacker McCauley scored for Georgetown at the 1:06 mark on a nice pass from David Hodgson. Again, using an extra attacker McCauley counted again with 0:31 seconds remaining on a passing play from McElroy and Pearce to narrow the gap 5-4.

Markham counted goal six on an empty net to end the championship match 6-4.

Each player participating in this tournament helped the team advance to the championship round. This being an extra tournament in the season, the boys did extremely well, advancing to the final. The calibre of hockey played in this tournament was excellent and the coaches were pleased with the results accomplished.

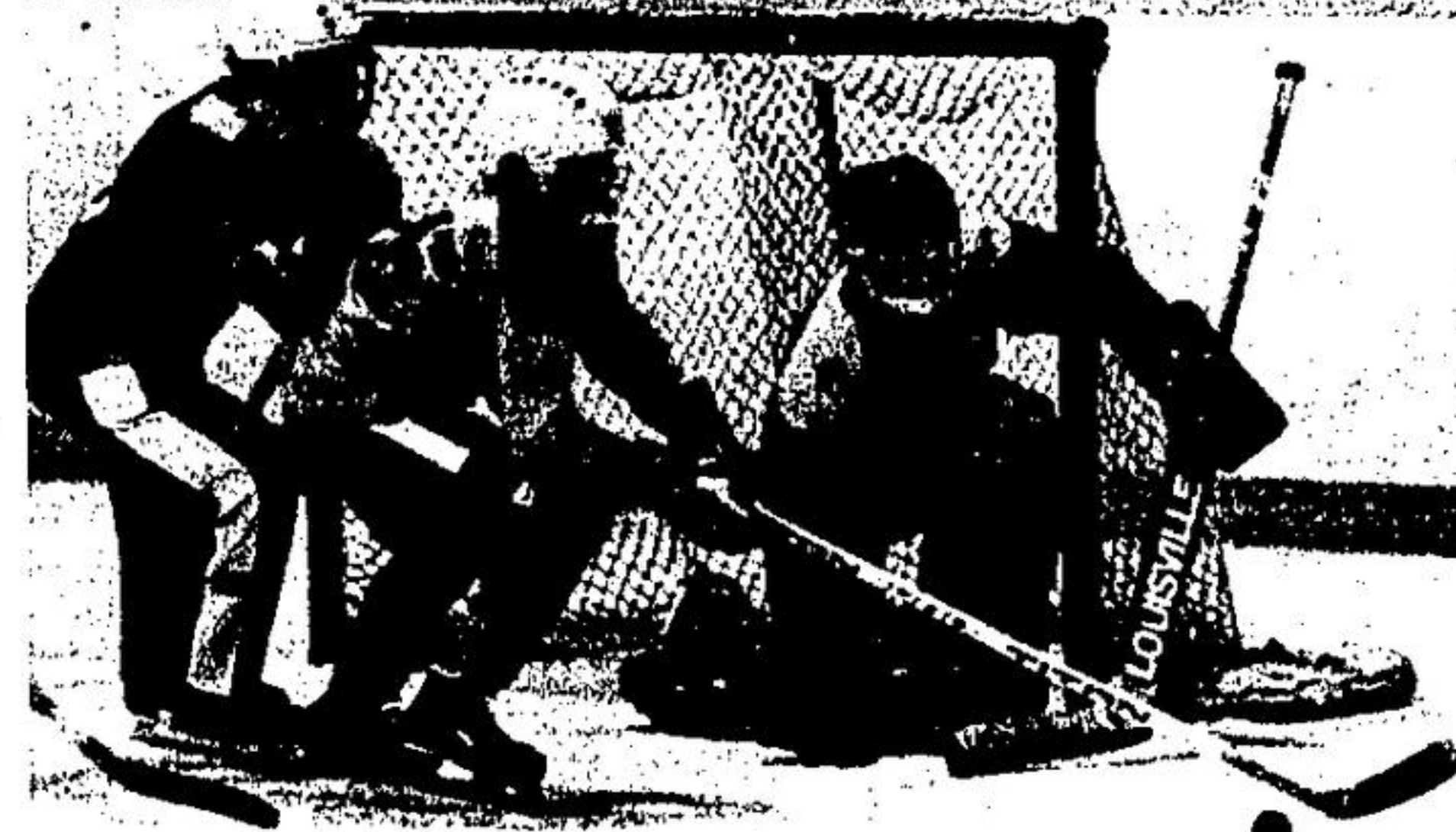


