In the first period of the Burlington game both teams came out fast, trying to run each other ragged. Ken Kavanagh put Acton up

tied the game on a power play while Karl Meyer was in the box, and went up 2 - 1 on a goal in the last minute of the period.

Acton started out very fast in the second period looking like they wanted to take control of the

game. They scored two goals early in the period. The first goal on a power play marker by Kavanagh, from Brian Demone and Mike Yelowica. The second one came off the stick of Mark Symes, on a pass from Rick Dodds.

The Sabres went up by two as Denis Kirton scored when he teamed up with Demone and Scott Kennedy. They then took a 5 - 2 lead when Paul Cargill scored his first goal of the season, unassisted.

In the third period, the Sabres came out fast again. Scott Kennedy scored his first goal of the season while Kirton and Demone earned assists. Burlington scored one more goal on the power play while Symes was in the penalty box, that was it for the Cougars as Sabre goalie Fred Fess played an outstanding game.

Coach Hudson of the Sabres said "the forwards were coming back and the team was hitting as well as skating."

Hudson went on to say he was working on the teams endurance a little more, and they were coming along well.

The line of Kavanagh, Damone and Yelowica was the most productive and hardest-working trio through the entire game. Another reason the Sabres won was because they were not taking stupid penalties, as Hudson went on to say.
