Norval hike Nov. 28

For those parents who are looking for good care for their children on Monday, Nov. 28, the Georgetown YMCA has packaged a fun filled day of activities.

Scuttle Stevens land purchase, citizens' group advises council

To the editor of The Herald:
As reported in your newspaper last week, a group of concerned citizens from across Halton Hills met last Sunday in Acton to organize opposition to Council's proposed new municipal complex on the Stevens' property in Georgetown.

At that time, any formal organization to the group was in its very rudimentary stage, and we were fortunate enough to appear as a hastily arranged delegation at Council's Oct. 31 meeting. This meeting, reported on at length in your newspaper, witnessed the formal passing by Council of a by-law to finalize the purchase of the Stevens' property.

Following the meeting, members of the group were asked by the press about the group's intended direction and objectives now that the property acquisition had finally been approved by Council. At that time, answers were not available.

They are now! The group met again this Saturday, with representation from Esqueving, Acton and Georgetown. After considerable discussion, co-ordinators from each area were named. As well, a research committee has been created to extensively review both the entire property purchase procedure and the issue of a new municipal complex.

The main objective of the group, as stated in the petitions that are circulating throughout Halton Hills, is to convince Council to divest itself of the Stevens' property and to direct all monies recovered towards renovations and/or additions to the existing Trafalgar Road municipal building if necessary.

As well, the group urges all those taxpayers opposed to the Stevens' property acquisition for municipal purposes to voice their concerns directly to those members of Council

who supported this purchase. We urge all citizens who support our position to express their opposition to this issue in a letter or phone call to Councillors who voted

Participate in a Basketball League that puts "Competition in Perspective". Your local YMCA is building on its 4th year of success in YBA (Youth Basketball Association). We serve each year 120 youths.

A program that is specifically founded in values education, YBA is designed for boys and girls to teach YBA values of fun, fitness, fair play, and teamwork. Many long hours are spent helping players to develop basketball skill and learn the rules of the game.

The strength of this program for youth is without a doubt the volunteer leadership of so many parents and friends of YBA players. In the past our volunteer leadership has been made up of 28 individuals, each donating on the average some 26 hours per season or on the whole 728 hours of service. These volunteers act as coaches, referees, and time keepers.

There is a Junior League for youth 8 to 10 years of age, and an Intermediate League for youth 11 to 13 years of age. The 13 week season consists of 3 weeks of team selection and skill sessions, and 10 weeks of league games. Each week your child has a game and an optional practice scheduled.
