Grads pick up 1983 diplomas

The Acton High School cafetorium was overflowing with proud kin Friday night as 141 Grade 12 graduates and 48 Grade 13 graduates received their diplomas at the school's annual commencement ceremonies.

"It's my sincere hope you will look back on your years here as having helped you live your life in the future," principal Betty Moore told the graduates seated below.

Forty-one scholarships, awards and bursaries were won by the graduating class. Of the Grade 13 graduates, 14 were Province of Ontario Scholars, meaning they had grade averages of 80 per cent or more.

"Don't stop searching, examining, growing," Halton Hills trustee Ariene Bruce told the young men and women. "You've just begun to tap your resources."

Among the highlights of the evening were the comical, personalized introductions English teacher Ross McGill gave each of the Grade 13 scholars crossing the stage to receive their diplomas. The blushes were plentiful as Dr. McGill ribbed them about past behavior and personality traits.

"I'm the only teacher on staff without a suit," Dr. McGill told the audience in a political dig. "I was going to buy one. then Davis told me about 9 and 5, so I bought a tle."

Valedictorian Paul Nolan received a standing ovation from fellow students for his speech.

"There were special relationships we'll never lose and that keep Bell Canada in business -the kind that prove you can put a price on friendship, every month," Paul said.

Acton is unique because of its size, he recognized, and attending high school was like being part of an extended family, "the likes of which we may nover see again." Teachers were seen as more than just instructors; they were seen as friends, Paul
