#### No plans to move

Union Gas has no plans to remove its local office out of Georgetown, Halton Hills Mayor Pete Pomeroy told town council Monday night. In September, Mayor Pomeroy said he was concerned by reports that the utility would close the Georgetown office, but, at a recent meeting with area representative Bob Seymour, was told no move would be made without council knowing about it. Council has also raised questions about gas rate subsidies for seniors and how Union Gas makes up its rates. Mayor Pomeroy said that Mr. Seymour would explain some of Union Gas' policies at a council meeting early next year.

#### Teaching about government

A recommendation will be presented to the town's general committee next week, encouraging school boards to teach youngsters about local government. Applauding a similar resolution from Stratford, Coun. Pam Sheldon said the low turn out in the recent Esquesing by-election indicates a lack of interest in local affairs. That interest, she argued, should be stimulated at a young age.
