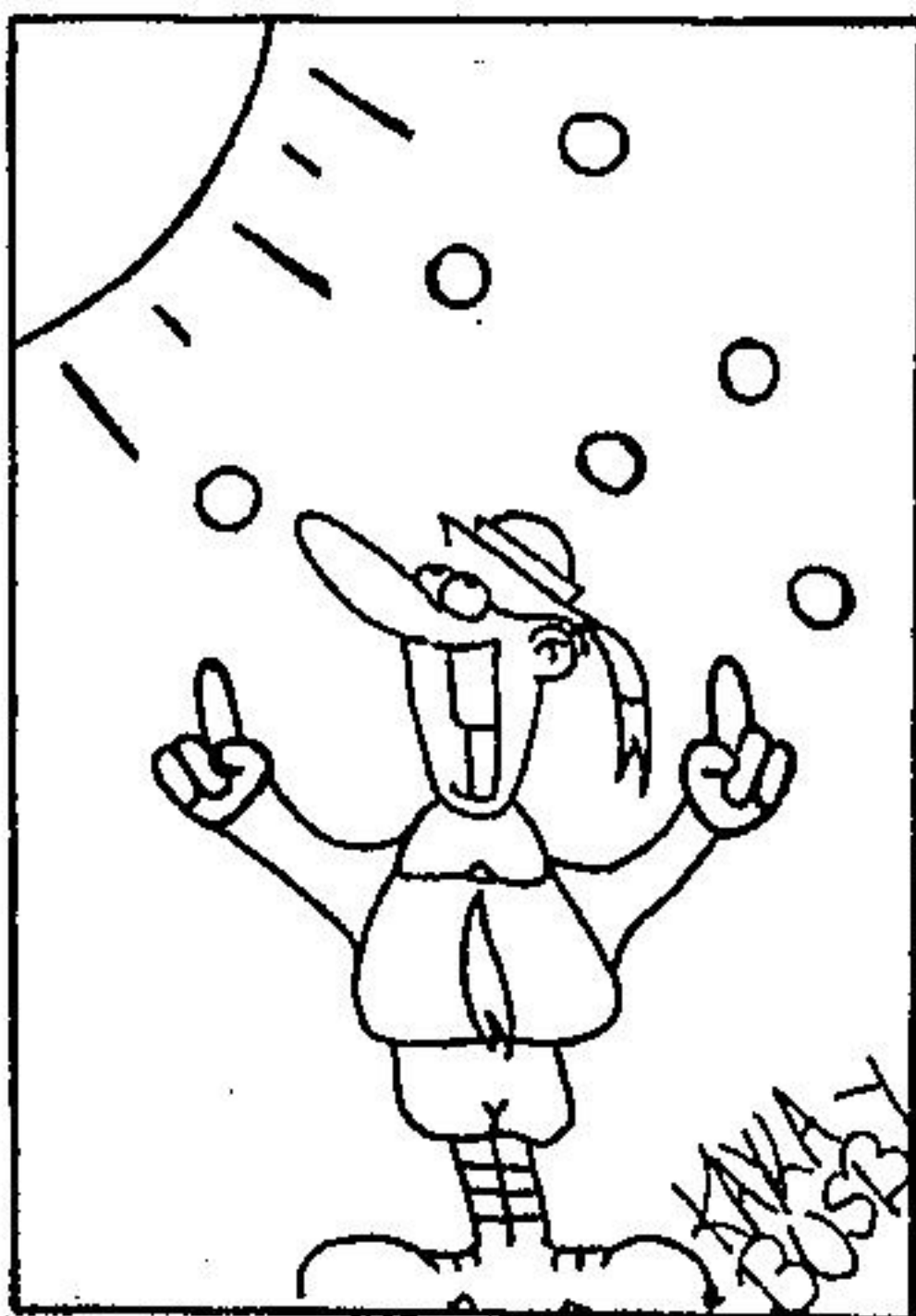


TRUE KIN
