**Made for protection**

Layers of ballistic nylon - the type of material used in bulletproof vests - is a main component in many of the items of clothing.

The boots, with a fluorescent orange foot and deep blue upper, resemble billy boots in shape - but not in construction. They have a heavy lug sole and tungsten cleats can be added for traction among wet logs or on ice.

**LEG PROTECTION**

Woodchuck also sells pants or aprons, using the same tightly-woven layers of protective nylon as the principle source of protection.

The torso of the body is rarely injured in the most common of chainsaw accidents - the kickback - Mr. Dautovich explained. However, the power of the chainsaw is great enough, that when it bucks, it can rapidly pivot the blade towards the operator's head.

So, the Woodchuck also has an extensive line of protective headgear.

Chainsaw users should wear ear muffs and a good construction helmet, as well as eye protection.

**HEADSET**

The Dautovichs have found a Swedish headset which incorporates all three features: a helmet which meets the specifications of the Canadian Standards Association; ear muffs and a face protecting screen.

The safety gloves are gauntlets, made of leather with a backing of ballistic nylon.
