Liftech atoms sweep two

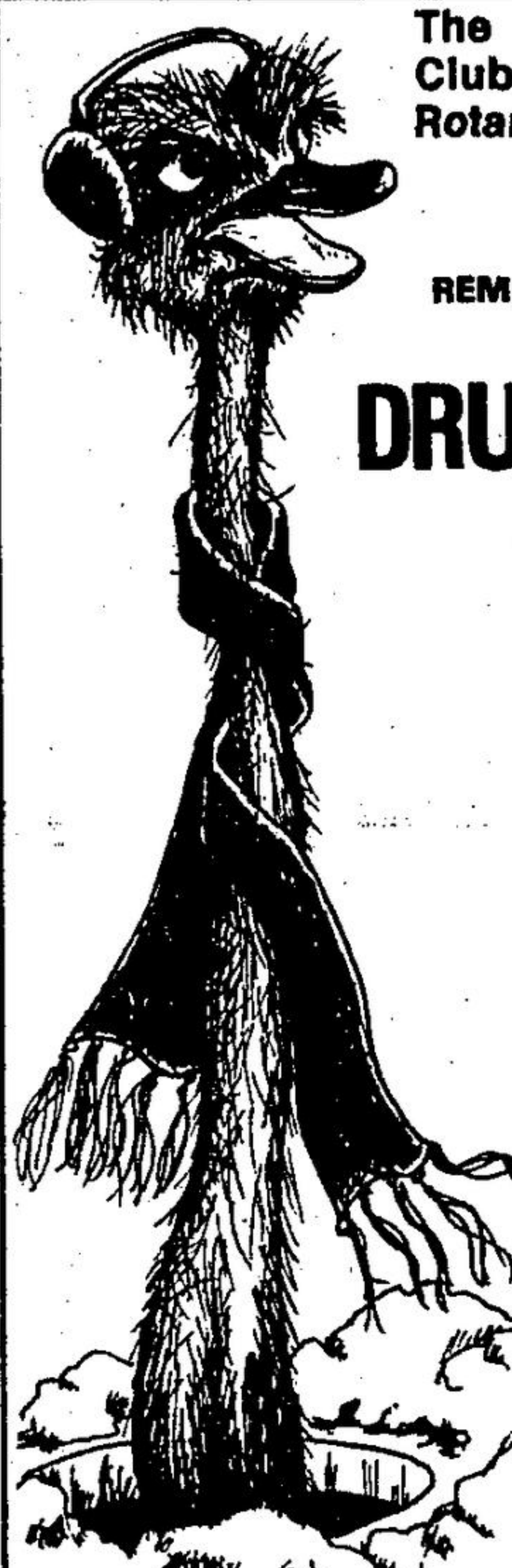
Brad Duby earned a hattrick and led the Georgetown Liftech major atoms to a 7-2 victory over Orangeville last week.

After the races Cornwell shrugged off complaints that the track was too rough.

Cornwell admitted his continual racing in the U.S. against top American riders is bound to give him an advantage but smiled as he added, "I enjoy racing at home - it's pure fun and there's no better exercise for racing than more racing!"
