WHEREAS, there is still a reluctance on the part of many citizens to involve themselves in action to insure the well-being of their fellow citizens, and

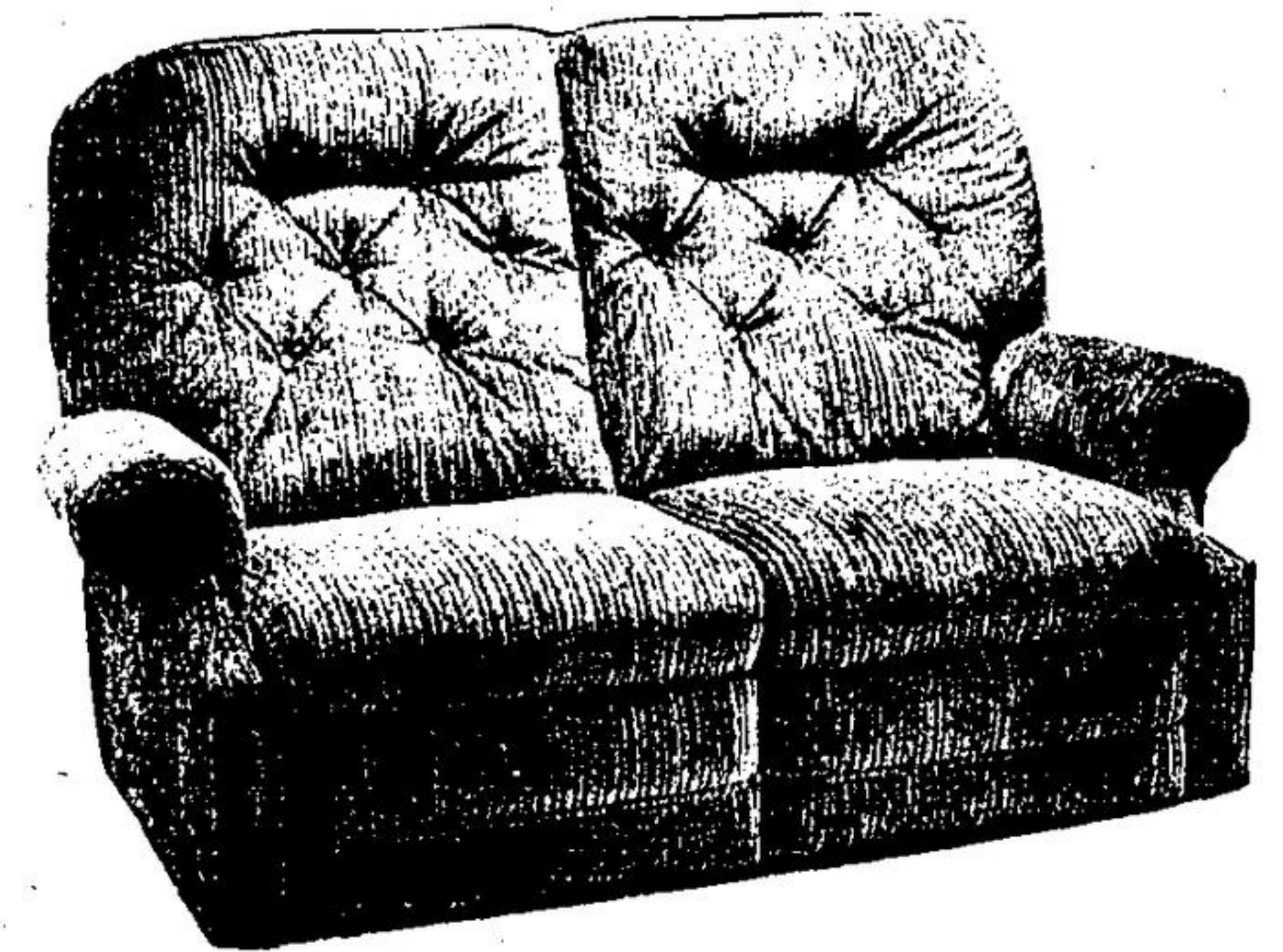
WHEREAS, Service clubs and their members continue to sponsor and support programs aimed at combating drugs through year-round efforts; now therefore be it
