Following close on the heels of the finish of regular Tri-County league play, the Georgetown Optimist minor peewees team travelled to Blenheim in the Chatham area this past weekend and brought home the Golden Acres Peewee Tournament Championship, a title last held by Georgetown in this tourney in 1977.

On Saturday Georgetown met Windsor for game one and defeated the Motor City team 4-2.

The second match was played Sunday at 7:30 a.m. against our arch-rivals Milton in an excellent team effort Georgetown handed Milton a 9-0 beating.

Fifteen seconds into the game Andy (Wheels) Pearce, with determination, beat the Milton defence, and scored after picking up his own rebound for the winning marker and revving up the black machine for their scoring blitz.

At 6:29 Dale McNiven counted on passes from Mark Lorto and Mike Barnes. At 1:58 Wes McCauley tallied on an unassisted effort. In the second frame at 6:07 Andy Pearce fired a high wrist shot between the London posts from Wes McCauley and Mark Lorto. At 1:53 McCauley gave Lorto a beautiful quick pass allowing him to break in alone to score. With 52 seconds remaining in this stanza London counted their only marker for the game.

In the third period Georgetown's fifth goal was fired home with a lot of determination by Dale McNiven while being pulled down from behind by a trailing Sabre defenceman. 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**REVISED REGIONAL OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT NO. 8**

**WATERFRONT PLAN IMPLEMENTATION POLICIES**

Council for the Regional Municipality of Halton has proposed an amendment to the Regional Official Plan Waterfront Implementation Policies.

The purpose of the amendment, known as Revised Amendment No. 8, is to provide more flexibility regarding funding and participants for the Waterfront Plan.

The existing financing provisions of the Plan require that 50-55 per cent of all funds for the acquisition of Waterfront properties be contributed by the Ministry of Natural Resources through the Halton Region Conservation Authority, while the remainder is contributed by the Region.

Recently the Region has encountered problems securing the necessary funds from the Ministry of Natural Resources as funding for Waterfront projects of this nature have been given a low priority.

Revised Amendment No. 8 will provide the Waterfront Plan with greater flexibility in two key areas:

1. Who can participate in the implementation of the Plan.
2. Who can participate in the financing aspect of the Plan.

Area Municipalities, the Federal Government and others will then be permitted to participate with the Region, Conservation Authority and Ministry of Natural Resources.

All interested citizens are invited to a Public Meeting, which will be held during the Planning and Public Works Committee meeting, for a presentation on the proposed amendment and to participate in an open forum of questions and answers on Amendment No. 8. Regional Councillors, Staff, and a representative from the Halton Region Conservation Authority will be present to reply to questions.
