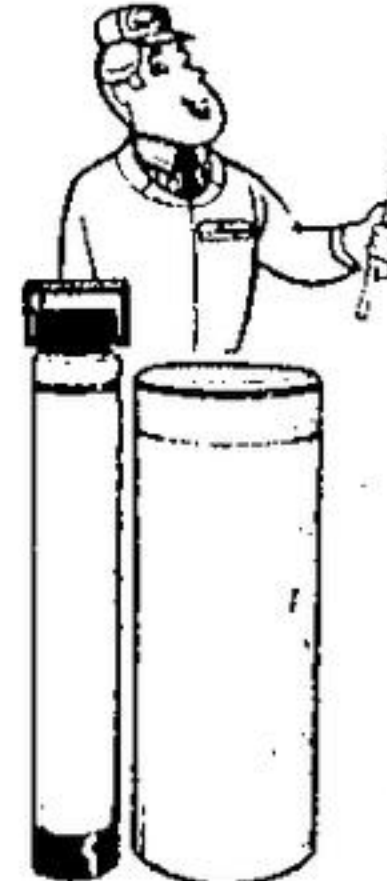

### Who will run old town hall?

**ACTON** - When restoration of the 100 year old former town hall is finished who will manage the building?

That was the question before members of the Chamber of Commerce at their meeting last week.

Heritage Acton Chairman Ted Tyler said the Chamber had been interested in the building in the past and he asked them to form a committee to run the

building for community events.

He said the Chamber has a "good cross-section" of people who could put their skills to use in managing the project.

Heritage Acton, using local, provincial and federal funds, is restoring the building at Willow and Bower streets.

The Chamber's tourism and marketing committee is studying Mr. Tyler's idea.

Members have already laid the ground work for a number of sub-committees and Feb. 27 at the annual general meeting a new executive will be elected to spearhead the recovery.

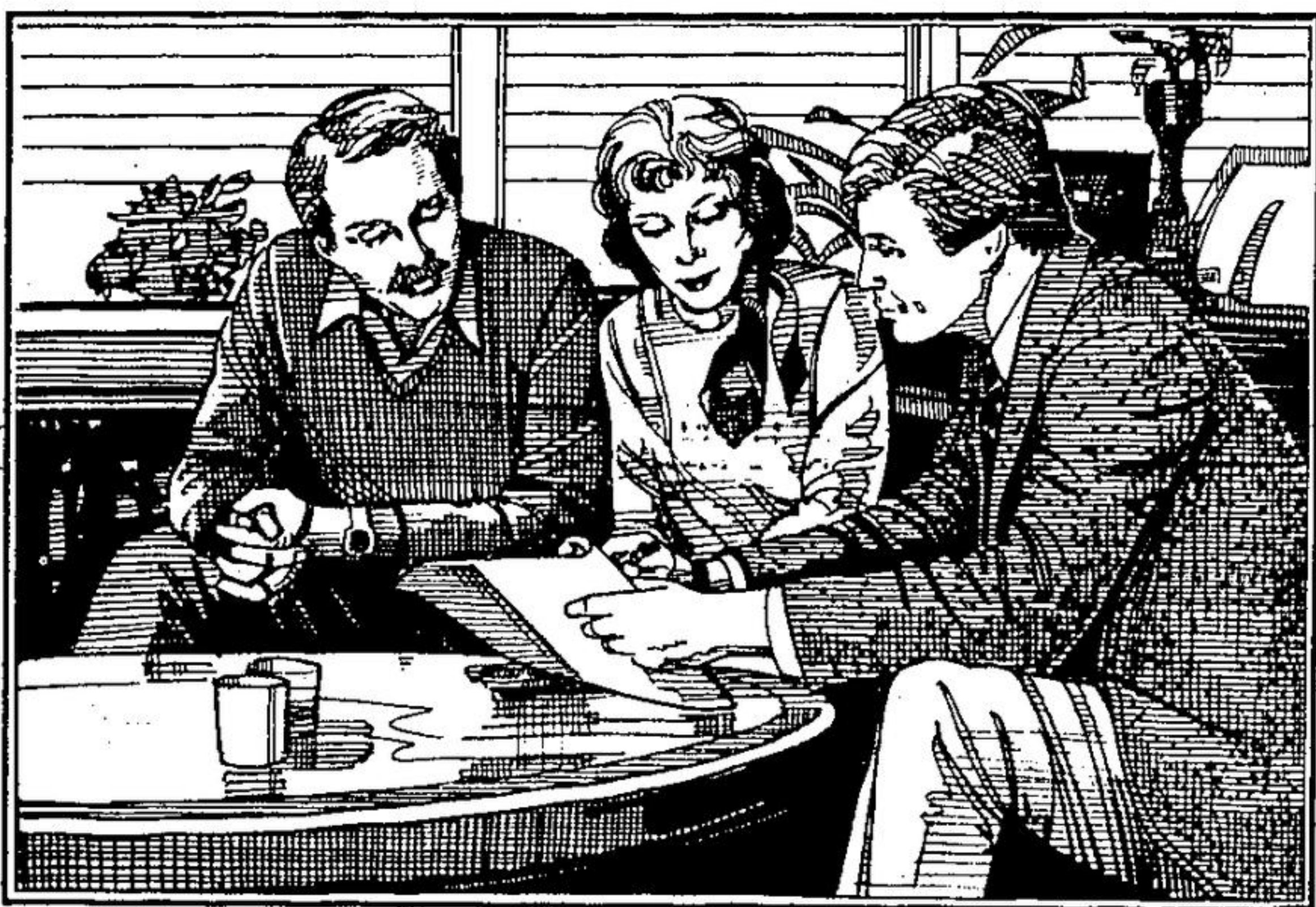
A membership committee has been hard at work stimulat-

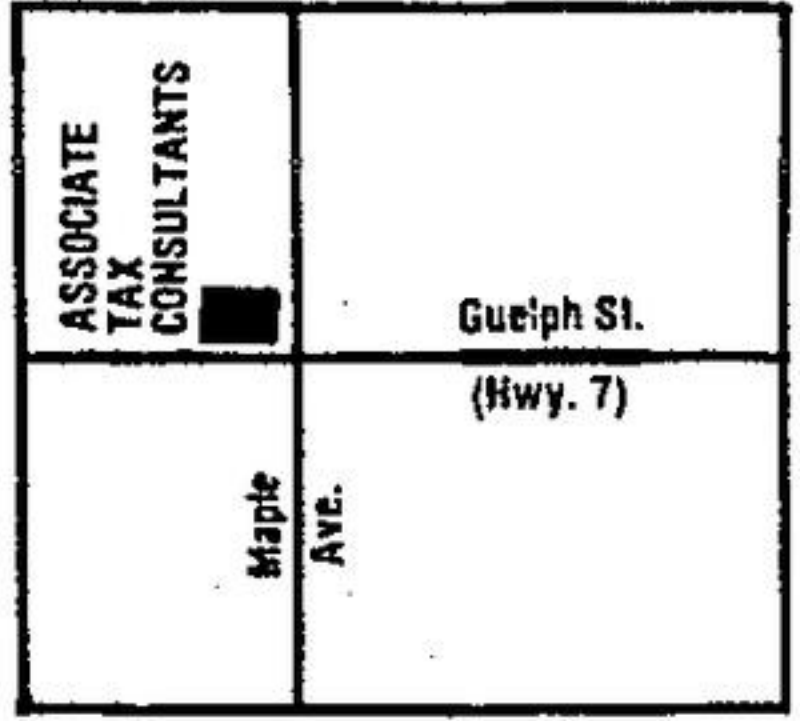
