## Region rejects funds for teens

There will be no regional funding for a program which helps north Halton teenagers cope with family problems at home.

Offered by the Burlington Youth Residence, the program in Milton and Halton Hills was denied \$4,600 by regional council last Wednesday.

The money would have helped bridge a gap between funding from the province's ministry of community and social services (COMSOC) and the actual cost of running the service for one year at 25 hours a week.

Program spokesman Hugo Felice told council that in 1983, 90 Milton and Halton Hills teenagers and girls and boys were helped in coping with a troubled family life, but there were as many as 156 referrals to the program.

Services and information Centre, where the program is based, rental costs for administrative space has been kept down, Mr. Felice said.

\$8,820. The Burlington United Way has contributed \$2,000 leaving a \$4,750 shortfall. The Burlington Youth Services was given \$25,725 for its programs in general as council passed social service grants for 1984. The agency had asked for \$47,860.

Oakville councillor Jackie Cutmore recommended the region give the program a financial boost.

Unless it's able to raise additional funds, the program may have to be cut back - work less hours - or shut down in eight or ten months, Mr. Felice explained.
