There will be no regional funding for a program which helps north Halton teenagers cope with family problems at home.

Offered by the Burlington Youth Residence, the program in Milton and Halton Hills was denied \$4,600 by regional council last Wednesday.

The money would have helped bridge a gap between funding from the province's ministry of community and social services (COMSOC) and the actual cost of running the service for one year at 25 hours a week.

Program spokesman Hugo Felice told council that in 1983, 90 Milton and Hallon Hills teenaged girls and boys were helped in coping with a troubled family life, but there were as many as 156 referrals to the program. .


