Laser disc at library for trial

Herald Staff You can drop it, spill coffee on it, scratch it, and it will still play beautiful music.

Shaped like a record album, the laser videodisc is made of aluminum with a heavy coating of vinyl, Silvery colored, it flashes rainbow shades, like gasoline on the pavement on a rainy day.

The laser videodisc is the latest purchase of the Halton Hills public library. Worth about \$60 a piece, the new discs are twice the price of video tapes. The library has bought 30 of them along with two laser videodisc players as a

\$4,000 pilot project.
"People have asked us why we haven't gone in for video tapes," audio visual technician Jeanette Thompson said. "We feel this system is the future, and for the library, less

hassle." LESS WORK The Japanese-made

system means less work for the library's audio visual services department. Video tapes are vulnerable to damage and require special care in splicing, a timeconsuming job, Mrs.
Thompson said.
The new audio visual

system wer introduced to Canada last fall by Pioneer Video Incorporated. It can be hooked into a stereo system or a

television. "We've been looking

the whole video thing. and what are they going to do next and what's becoming obsolete, Chief Librarian Betsy

Cornwell said. If the library had gone into video tapes, it would have had to have a duplicate system for Beta and VHS owners, doubling library costs. It wouldn't have been fair to have one system without the other, Mrs. Cornwell said.


The video tapes are easy to erase, damage and copy, problems which the laser system doesn't have, she said.

TWO-WAY A more expensive system, the videodiscs allow for two-way communication between the viewer and the TV screen.

"We think it's a natural for the educational system. You can stop anywhere and work on a program over and over without damaging the disc," Mrs. Cornwell

With the videodisc player, which looks much like a stereo turntable, you can scan forward or reverse, and with the freeze-frame button, stop the picture or step it back and forth one frame at a time.

The system allows for "Interactive television" and Hocus Pocus, Histo-. ry Disc Quiz and Mystery Disc 1 are three such discs now in the library's collection.


