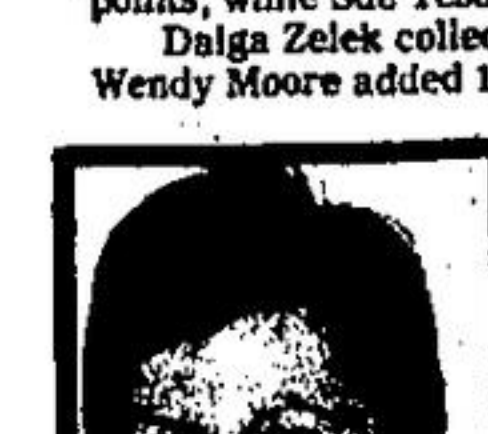
Barb Curry contributed 13 points to the winning Capricorn attack. Pat Nessitt hit for 10 points, and Meredith MacLaren had eight.
