

Catholic cemeteries exempt from Act

The Catholic poor will continue to be buried in municipal cemeteries if the three Catholic cemeteries in Halton are unwilling to donate the grave.
Last week, regional councillors upheld current policy that the region not pay for the cost of graves for the poor.
According to Section 53 of the Cemeteries Act, cemeteries are to provide plots for the poor, free of charge.

The Act gives the region the power to request the free graves from municipal cemeteries and incorporated companies.
The Catholic Cemeteries feel their unique corporate status exempts them from this Act, and the Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations agrees with them. It means the region cannot insist the Catholic Cemeteries provide free graves to the Catholic poor.
In a letter to the

region, Catholic Cemeteries executive director Robert O'Brien asked that Halton pay for graves provided in funerals for needy Catholics. Catholic Cemeteries offered the region a 17 per cent discount on the cost of burials for the poor (\$389 as compared to \$434). For the plot, Halton would be charged \$108 instead of \$152.

The region currently pays for the costs of opening and closing and perpetual care in all cemeteries.
If the Burlington, Acton and Georgetown Catholic cemeteries insist on payment for plots for the poor, needy Catholics will be buried in municipal cemeteries.
