She has appeared in 'No Sex Please We're British', 'Miracle Worker', 'Billy Liar', 'Separate Tables', 'Our Town', 'Count Dracula' and many more.

Her performance as Sybil in Count Dracula won her a THEA for Best Supporting Actress in 1980. She has been nominated for this award on three other occasions; for her performance as Clare in 'A Delicate Balance', as Mrs. Stratten in 'Letters from The General', and Emma in 'Summer Of The 17th Doll'.

Pat is obviously enjoying the role of Ethel and is often very moved by the emotional highs and lows Ernest Thompson has so beautifully laced together in this touching play.

Quiet dentist not unlike John Carter

John Carter has always had an interest in the theatre. His portrayal as Bill the dentist in Georgetown Little Theatre's production of 'On Golden Pond' will mark his third appearance in the theatre.

Apart from Mr. Carter's interest in the theatre he wanted to prove to himself that he could get on the stage and become a believable character.

Mr. Carter sees Bill the dentist as a serious person with a sense of humour although it is difficult for him to display this sense of humour. Some of the similarities between the character Bill and Mr. Carter's own views of himself are that Bill is a fairly shy character and tending to be on the serious side. "Because of some of these qualities it is not all that out of character for me," he said.

Heathcote. A professional director from Toronto, Mr. Carter finds it very interesting to work with him. "I get an awful lot from him as a professional," he said.

This is the largest part Mr. Carter has had in the plays he has taken part in. With ten pages of dialogue Mr. Carter thinks he will be able to get over some of his nervousness and get on with the show.

Referring to his parts in other plays Mr. Carter said, "when you're on for a short period of time it's scary getting on, once you're into the dialogue it's time to get off."

Some of the problems Mr. Carter cites with being in a theatre production is the learning of the lines to the extent that you can use them comfortably with the other actors and can relate and react to the action that is going on simultaneously.

challenge, he said. Mr. Carter finds going on stage and being part of a large group effort both stimulating and creative. "Portraying a character as well as you can gives you a real sense of achievement, it's scary as well, but fun."

Also acting as treasurer with GLT Mr. Carter thinks the theatre group adds to the character of Georgetown and helps enrich the fabric of the town. "It's a good group of people that compose the theatre and it's fun and interesting being involved with it."

Problems concerning the current Croatian Centre facilities on Winston Churchill Boulevard got their first airing Thursday.

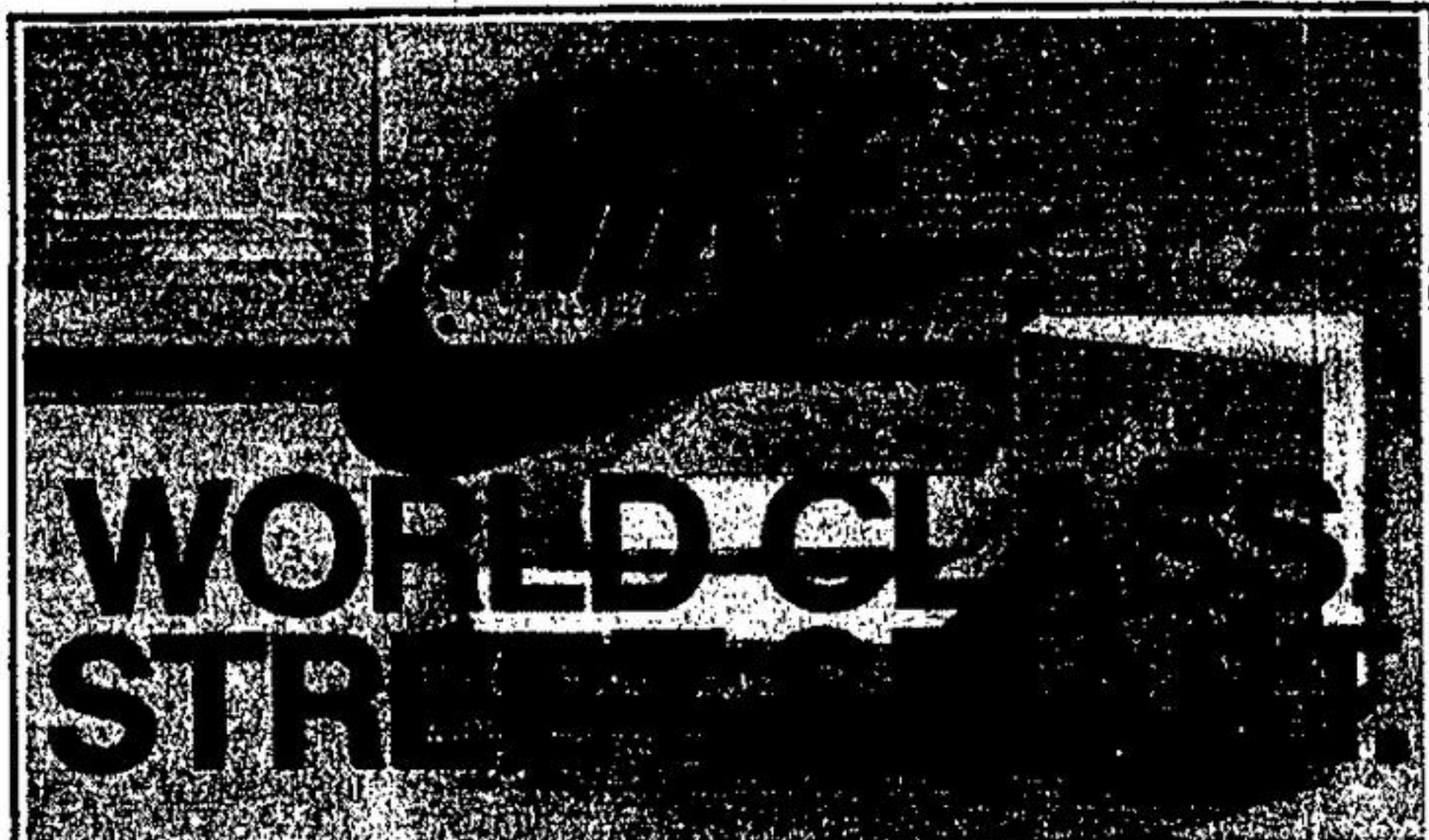
"I felt it was a very positive meeting," town clerk administrator Ken Richardson said.
