Georgetown Y has new league

The Georgetown Y.M.C.A. has developed a brand new sports league for children in Georgetown and surrounding area. Based on the Y.M.C.A.'s enormous success in the youth basketball program, YBA, which serves an average of 120 children per year, this new league has been introduced.

Jennifer Arnold also set an unofficial mark in her leg of the 800, shaving four seconds off the old standard of 2:42:2.
