Former dairy owner delivered milk for 8¢

Georgetown was a mere 3,400 in population when Irwin Noble, 70, bought the Georgetown Dairy in 1949.

It was a daring step up for the former butter maker with the meat packing Swift Canadian Company. Before that, he'd peddled milk at eight cents a quart, going door to door in Orangeville with a horse and wagon.

"I've been in the dairy business all my life," Mr. Noble said.

In Georgetown, his dairy delivered milk to almost 2,100 homes. There were seven delivery routes, each with 250 to 300 homes.

"Neilson's Limited does as much in one day as I used to do in a year," Mr. Noble chuck-

led. "That's progress in 30 years."

By 1959, Mr. Noble's horse and wagon deliveries were replaced by trucks, and in 1971, the business was sold.

Believing that keeping busy keeps you young, Mr. Noble tackled more than just his dairy during his Georgetown working years.

During 1954 to 1956 he served as a town councillor and the street on which he lives, Noble Court, was named after him. Jack Armstrong was mayor at the time.

As a councillor, Mr. Noble was there when developer Rex Heslop came to town and 1,300 acres were annexed to him.

After his stint as councillor, he served on the town's planning board and committee of adjustment for many years.

Active in golf, curling, bowling and gardening, Mr. Noble also drives for the Children's Aid Society and the Cancer Society.

He and his wife were voted Citizens of the Year by the Georgetown Lions Club in 1975.
