Georgetown was a mere 3,400 in population when Irwin Noble, 70, bought the Georgetown Dairy in 1949.

It was a daring step up for the former butter maker with the meat packing Swift Canadian Company. Before that, he'd peddled milk at eight cents a quart, going door to door in Orangeville with a horse and wagon.

"I've been in the dairy business all my life," Mr. Noble said,

In Georgetown, his dairy delivered mllk to almost 2,100 homes. There were seven delivery routes, each with 250 to 300 homes.

By 1959, Mr. Noble's horse and wagon deliveries were replaced by trucks, and in 1971, the business was sold.

After his stint as councillor, he served on the town's planning board and committee of adjustment for many

Active in golf, curling, bowling and gardening, Mr. Noble also drives for the Children's Aid Society and the Caucer

Society. He and his wife were voted Citizens of the Year by the Georgetown Lions Club in 1979.


