## One number for elderly unnecessary, rejoins information centres claim

Having one number that seniors in the region can call for information isn't necessary, the region's health and social services committee was told Tuesday afternoon.

Representatives from the region's five information centres, including Georgetown's Contact Centre and Acton's Social Services and Information Centre, think it'll be duplicating existing services for the elderly.

The single phone number idea was suggested in a recently released report on the elderly. The consultants' study looked at regional planning for the needs of the elderly.

"It's an idea that's been kicked around for some time," Acton Social Services and Information Centre's executive direclor Peggie Balkind said.
