

### POLICE BEAT

#### Careless driving

A Waterloo man caused an estimated \$5000 damage to the Datsun SX he was driving when he apparently lost control of the vehicle while attempting to pass a tractor trailer on Trafalgar Road near Steeles Avenue early Saturday morning.

While northbound on Trafalgar Road the vehicle went onto the shoulder of the road and back onto the road. Returning back to the shoulder of the road the vehicle went into the ditch and rolled over.

The driver, who wasn't injured in the incident, was charged with careless driving.

#### Collision with tree

An Acton man was treated and released from Georgetown District Memorial Hospital last Friday evening after the 1979 Pontiac he was driving collided with a tree.

He apparently lost control of the vehicle and caused an estimated \$2000 damage to the front end while leaving a trailer park on the 1st Line in Acton.

#### Purse snatched

A wallet containing a small amount of cash and various credit cards was taken from a purse in the kitchen of St. John's United Church in Georgetown.

#### Motorecycle mishap

A Georgetown man is listed in satisfactory condition at Georgetown District Memorial Hospital after he apparently lost control of the 1980 Yamaha motorcycle he was driving on the loose asphalt on Ewing Street in Georgetown.

Edward Cherwonlak received a fractured right ankle in the incident which happened early Friday evening. The motorcycle received \$300 damage to its left side and gas tank.

#### Biker hospitalized

A Guelph man was treated and released from Georgetown District Memorial Hospital early Thursday afternoon after he apparently lost control of the 1982 Honda motorcycle he was driving on Highway 7 near Mary Street.

The motorcycle received \$2000 damage when it hit a curb and continued into a guardrail post after approaching a 90 degree curve while travelling eastbound on Highway 7.

#### Sneezy situation

An Acton man who began sneezing and lost control of the 1974 Chevrolet he was driving has been charged with failing to report an accident.

On Sunday evening, while northbound on 1st Line near Halton Road 12, the vehicle travelled off the roadway and collided with a hydro pole.

The driver then went home and drank three quarters of a bottle of brandy before reporting the accident to police.
