moon's orbit is farthest partial eclipse in Halton away from the earth and does not appear An annular solar large enough to cover the sun completely from any point on the earth.

> The eclipse will begin at approximately 10:20 a.m. EST and will reach its peak at approximately 11:45 a.m. before ending at about 1:14 p.m. EST.

Tom Beer, who is head of the science department at Georgetown District High School, said "this type of eclipse doesn't happen that often."

"You won't see anything like it until 2024," he said. "I remember that date because I'll be a hundred years old then."

DUSK Mr. Beer said "It will be dusk for a fair length of time," and as a precautionary measure has distributed an outline of the eclipse and the best way to view the eclipse to the teachers in his department for the students' benefit.

The only way to safely view the eclipse is through an indirect method. The pin-hole camera is the simplest indirect viewer of all.

Cut a four inch square hole in the centre of an 18 to 24 Inch square piece of cardboard. Tape a piece of aluminum foil into this square and punch a pin hole about one-eighth inch in diameter in the centre of the foil.

Tape the card against the glass of a south facing window and an image of the sun will appear in the centre of the shadow of a card on the apposite wall. At a distance of ten feet the image will be about one inch in diameter.

Binoculars, telescopes and camera viewfinders are extremely dangerous and can end up literally "cooking" the cells of the eye's retina.
