Auxiliary member

A long time resident of Georgetown, Janet McDougal, passed away at Georgetown District Memorial Hospital on May 30, 1984.

Originally born in Shelburne, Ontario, Mrs. McDougal attended Chapel Street Public School and Georgetown District High School. She was a permanent member of the office staff at Abitibi Provincial Paper Ltd.

Through her affiliation with Knox Presbyterian Church in Georgetown she taught Sunday School and was the Superintendent there for 17 years.

Mrs. McDougal was a chartered member of the Business and Professional Women's Club and the Georgetown and District Naturalists Club. She was also a member of the Horticultural Society, Toronto Field Naturalists Club, GDMH Auxiliary and life member of the Ontario Hospital Auxiliary Association.

Mrs. McDougal is survived by the Reverend Dr. Brian Frazer of Toronto, who was one of the pallbearers.

The funeral was held by Reverend Peter Barrow from Knox Presbyterian Church on June 1, at the family plot in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown.

On horseback

Month-long parade ends in Ballinafad

Celebrating Ontario's bicentennial in a very traditional sense will be a group of people hoping to travel by horse from Georgian Bay and the Ottawa River to Halton Hills.

The Ontario Trail Riders Association has planned a "Journey Into Yesterday" parade of horses that will take place from July 24 until August 25.

The parade will end at Scottdale Farm just outside of Ballinafad.

Participants are expected to come from all age groups and walks of life. Some will be on horseback while others will participate on bicycle, by foot or by an traditional means.

Descendants of the original settler families will be invited to sign a scroll and to record the name of the original settler family, their origin, date of settlement and land grant site.

Two groups will start at different points: one near Renfrew near the Ottawa River and the other from Depot Harbour just south of Parry Sound.

The riders will then meet at Whitney, August 4 and travel together down to Halton Hills

where the parade will end at the Scottdale Farm.

The Ontario Trail Riders Association is an organization of horse enthusiasts dedicated to the development and preservation of multi-use, four-season recreational trails in Ontario.

The OTRA is holding a meeting in Georgetown Monday June 11 at Cedarvale Community Centre to see if local residents want to share in their plans for the bicentennial project.

The meeting starts at 8 p.m. For more information call 526-1897.

Helping out with the project is sponsorship funding from the Ontario Ministry of Tourism and Recreation, the Office of the Bicentennial and the Ontario Equestrian Federation.

Customers fight

An investigation is under way by the Halton Regional Police Force after an assault took place at the Burger King restaurant on Guelph Street in Georgetown.

A Georgetown man was kept overnight at Georgetown District Memorial Hospital last Saturday after he received a black eye and minor head injuries.

The man was trying to break up a fight between two customers at the time of the assault.

Course damaged

An estimated total of \$10 in damages occurred to the Georgetown Golf Course sometime over the weekend. A flag pole and golf ball washer were damaged in the incident and there was minor damage done to a green. The course is located at 17th Sideroad and 10th Line.

\$18 jeans stolen

A shopping bag containing a pair of blue jeans was taken after it had been left unattended in front of the Royal Cafe in Acton.

The bag and its contents had an estimated value of \$18 and the incident happened on Saturday afternoon.

Dog hit by car

A Georgetown teenager lost control of her 1982 Plymouth and went into a ditch after hitting a dog on 10th Line just north of 17th Sideroad.

The dog was killed in the incident which happened last Wednesday evening.

An estimated \$400 damage was done to the fender of the vehicle and no charges were laid.

Cadillac damaged

An estimated \$40,000 in damages were done to a tractor trailer driven by a Loretto, Ont. man after it hit a 1976 Cadillac driven by a Georgetown teenager.

The Cadillac had been travelling southbound on Main Street in Acton and when turning onto Cobblehill Road veered into the path of the tractor trailer in the northbound lane. The Cadillac received \$3,000 in damages to the front end.

The driver of the Cadillac received minimal injuries in the incident, as did one of her two passengers. The tractor trailer driver was not injured in the Wednesday morning incident.

House robbed

Approximately \$300 in goods and \$160 in cash were stolen from a residence on the 8th Line in Georgetown sometime over Sunday, June 4.

Entry was gained through a rear door which Halton regional police believe was forced. Among the items missing in the incident are two TVs and a stereo.

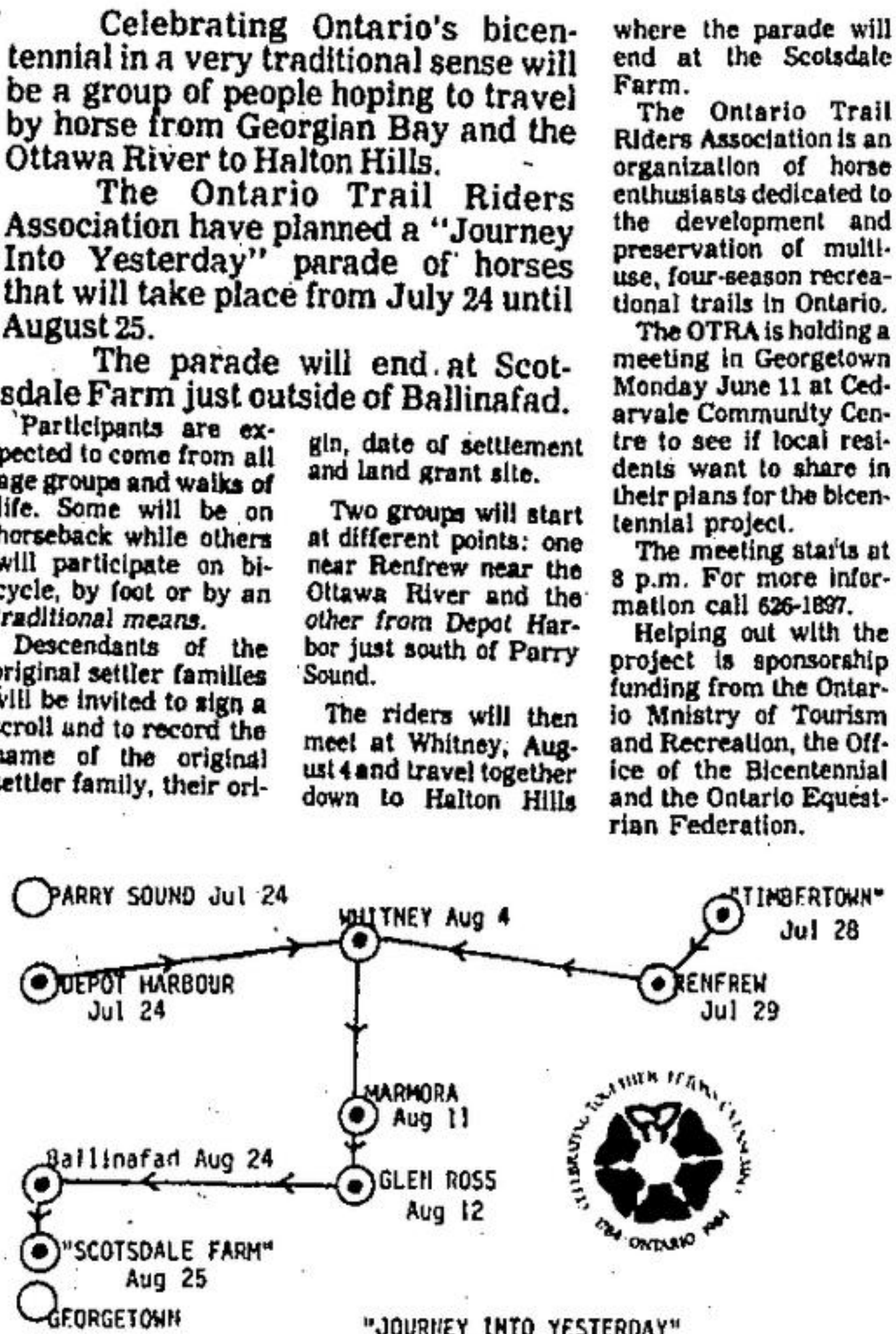
Fruity group

Time is running out. The Esquering Historical Society's waiting for your essays.

Entries in the Historical Society's Bicentennial Essay Contest must be postmarked no later than June 15 and mailed to them at Box 51, Georgetown, Ontario L7G 4T1.

Elementary school students are invited to write about an Esquering resident, famous or unknown. The resident doesn't have to be prominent and can be from the past or the present. Prizes are \$15, \$10, \$5 and \$2.

The Historical Society is also looking for a history of any school opened before 1950 in Esquering. High school

students are asked to submit an essay on this topic, and note that the school doesn't have to be open today. Prizes are \$20, \$15, and \$10.

There are two categories for adult history buffs to write on. You can write about "Early Memories of my Esquering Community" in which you recollect about people or events that stand out in your memory.

Or, you can write a "History of a Group" which would be an essay on the history of a group or organization from Esquering Township. Prizes are \$40, \$15, and \$10 for each of the two adult topics.
