## Councillors won't collect cash retroactively

In a recorded vote Monday night, town councillors voted 8 to 4 to not collect cash-in-lieu of parkland from land owners whose severances were approved March 27 by the Land Division Committee.

Coun. Pam Sheldon asked that the money not be collected from those whose severances were approved just prior to the town policy being passed April 16.

Speaking on behalf of Julius Geist, one of the three residents whose severance was approved March 27, Coun. Sheldon said the Land Division Committee imposed the new policy before it had been passed by council.

The policy collects cash-in-lieu of parkland in all severances which create residential building lots.

Although the proposed bylaw was one of the conditions of the granting of the three severances, Coun. Sheldon said applicants to the Committee couldn't debate it March 27 because they didn't know of it beforehand.

"The key point is how it was done," Coun. Sheldon said. "In my opinion, council makes

the policy then the staff implements it. It was the other way around here, with the policy retroactive. I don't think it's right and I don't think it's fair."

Coun. Mike Armstrong asked if there had been any contact from Mr. Todd or Jack King asking to be exempt from the new council policy. Clerk-administrator Ken Richardson said there hadn't been.

"I'm not about to glad hand, because this is what we need to keep the town coffers alive," Coun. Armstrong said in voicing his objection to the Geist request.

Coun. Dave Whiting objected to the retroactive manner in which council was trying to collect on the bylaw.

"It's \$2,200 that the town could be big-hearted and say that the policy is in effect from the time it was passed," he said. "It's not a lot of money and I think we should set the policy from the date it's passed."

All but Couns. Ross Knechtel, Harry Levy and Mayor Miller voted to not enforce the bylaw retroactively. Coun. Jake Kulken was absent. A motion to defer action for a week was lost.
