Grit membership tally tops 3,000

Membership in the Brampton-Georgetown Liberal Association reached a staggering 3,141 last Tuesday — the cut-off date for new members before next Tuesday's nomination meeting.
On June 26 there were 657 members, and 2,124 were added yesterday by the three candidates vying for the nomination. Members added between June 26 and yesterday and those eligible to renew make up the

rest of the 3,141. Supporters of Mr. Kevin Coelho, who has lived in Brampton since March, came in with 1,586 new members. Mr. Ross Milne, former MP brought in 534 new members last night. Mr. Ed Smith, association treasurer added eight to the list. He says he's still in the race, despite the high number of members brought in by other candidates. "I've got to see the

first ballot," he said in an interview this morning. He said the meeting should be moved from Central Peel Secondary School, which will only hold about 800 in its gymnasium. Mr. Milne said he still intends to win the nomination "but we're going to have to work hard to do that." Mr. Milne's campaign chairman Mr. Rick Weiler said he's delighted with the number of Liberal members.

"I don't know when the Liberal party was ever stronger in this city," he said this morning. "I don't want to be in John McDermid's shoes this morning." Coelho was predicting a close battle. "Ross is a formidable opponent," he said today. "We have a grass-roots movement going. That's my strong ability. I've been an organizer." He said he and his

supporters are pledged to support Milne if Milne captures the nomination. "If I lose, then my team and myself are behind the winner 200 per cent. I am determined this is going to become a Liberal seat."

Chamber breaks even

Although the final tally isn't in, it looks as though the Chamber of Commerce's BIG (Business in Georgetown) Celebration was a success financially. At their annual general meeting Thursday it was announced the Chamber made a \$323 profit on the affair. The celebration was budgeted for \$36,945 in expenditures. However, it won't be known until the sale of the souvenir coins are completed what the exact figures are. There are now \$9,398 worth of coins in circulation, but holders of the coin have until September to redeem them for actual dollars. The souvenir coin is considered legal tender by participating merchants until then.

A special presentation called "Christ in the Passover" will be featured Sunday July 15 at the 11 a.m. worship service of the Georgetown Alliance Church. The church meets temporarily in the Cedarvale Community Centre. The purpose of the "Christ in the Passover" presentation is to enhance the understanding of Jewish backgrounds to the Christian communion service. A table is set with the traditional Jewish Passover items, including representative foods which are explained but not eaten. Ancient and modern customs are discussed and described with an emphasis on the redemption that Jesus Christ accomplished when He died on the cross. The service is presented through the kindness of Jews for Jesus of Canada. "Christ in the Passover" has been presented over a thousand times in many churches. Many believe that key elements of christian faith and teaching are implied in this Passover celebration. The church extends a warm welcome to all for this special service.

Pit permit debate

Reconstruction of Guelph Street may be held up if Armbrro Materials and Construction Limited are denied a wayside pit permit from the C. Boss Gravel deposit on Lot 23 Concession 5. Although town councillors approved the permit to extract 32,000 tonnes of gravel from the pit last week, Coun. Dave Whiting said he expected the Niagara Escarpment Commission of which he is a member, to deny the permit. "Your chances of getting this permit are one to 100 now to get it through the NEC," he said. "We got the last one through with quite a fight. Don't be surprised if it's turned down." Coun. Whiting said the NEC has been consistently denying pit permits in the Caledon area.

Loiter law costly

Parents may be liable for a fine of up to \$1,000 if their children, under 16 years old, are caught loitering after 10 p.m. in Halton Hills. Since the May long weekend Halton regional police have noticed a marked increase in vandalism and car thefts and link the majority of these crimes to the 12 to 16 year old age bracket. After enforcing the law last October, which is under the child welfare act, police reported vandalism down by 70 per cent during the following months. The key word in the enforcement of the curfew is "loiter". Police are not after children returning from a movie or the local store but rather the kids who loiter around arcades, shopping malls and school yards.
