#### Loiter law costly

Parents may be liable for a fine of up to \$1,000 if their children, under 16 years old, are caught loitering after 10 p.m. in Halton Hills.

Since the May long weekend Halton regional police have noticed a marked increase in vandalism and car thefts and link the majority of these crimes to the 12 to 16 year old age bracket. After enforcing the law last October, which is

under the child welfare act, police reported vandalism down by 70 per cent during the following months.






