All too often we are very quick to criticize and find it easy to complain, but on behalf of concerned people everywhere, I feel an apology is warranted to the Georgetown dentists who do an excellent job, very often under a lot of pressure and trying circumstances.

Since the dentists in Georgetown practise preventive dentistry; i.e. preventing most types of emergencies, had the patient phoned their own dentist, or any of the 10 in Georgetown, or the hospital, there would be no need to call "every-one: Georgetown, Peel and Mississauga Hospitals," and 40 dentists, to receive care.
