

# Play about sex abuse here in fall

A presentation for adults on an educational program to help children ward off sexual abuse is slated for the Halton Hills Cultural Centre sometime this fall.

that a theatrical presentation entitled 'Mission from YDOB' (body spelt backwards) be presented to parents of students in Halton for response and evaluation. The play is designed to teach children personal safety considerations in relation to the type of touching they

receive in an effective, entertaining and non-threatening way," said George Heavor, superintendent of curriculum services. Metro Toronto Chairman Paul Godfrey commissioned a pilot program which was carried out in Toronto schools last year. Hal-

ton's three part program, (the play, a teacher's resource kit and an orientation session) is based on the Toronto program. The play consists of an imaginary character, Personna, who meets a variety of situations and people. Some of the situations are pleasant and fun and some potentially dangerous.

although sexual abuse is not a prime concern in Halton, it is significant enough to consider adopting the program. The board's language arts consultant, Micki Clemens said sexual abuse is the most hidden form of child abuse and the potential for psychological damage is large in this area.

Halton Hills trustee Dick Howitt, who saw the play in Hamilton last year, said, "You really have to see the play to appreciate it," and went on to say the play would be excellent as an ongoing yearly program in our schools. The report will come back to the board for action on August 25.

The audience is encouraged to help Personna find solutions to the problems and help her protect herself. It is believed this type of presentation will help children to become responsible for their own bodies and to recognize the difference between nurturing and exploitive touch. Mr. Heavor said that

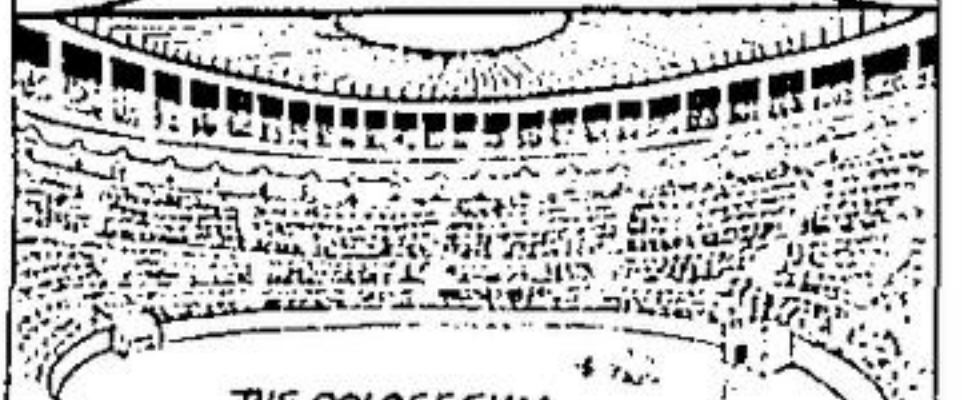
