In Acton

Three landowners agree to drilling

Regional chairman Peter Pomeroy and Clerk Administrative officer Dennis Perlin will be asked to sign agreements with three Acton property owners today. The agreements give the region authorization to start test drilling at sites on Fourth Line near the Town Line Road (Sideroad 32). "We're hopeful we'll find a supply of water on one of those sites," Halton public works manager of engineering Riek Robertshaw told The Herald Monday. Once the formality of signing the agreement

with the respective property owners is done, actual drilling on the four sites can begin.

The Fourth Line sites were recommended by consultants Morrison Beatty Limited after a review of Acton's hydrogeological features.

It's estimated the cost of testing one site is \$12,500. The actual drilling and test pumping makes up \$7,500 of this amount. According to the consultants, testing takes eight weeks.

Additional wells are being sought because existing wells in Acton aren't adequate for the town's 7,000 population.

One of the requirements of the final well site is that it not interfere with existing area wells.

Legion centre helping ex-servicemen

government agencies and services at the local, regional, provincial and

federal level will be kept. The office at 127 Mill St. will be open Wednes-

days from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m.
