11/4 c. dark corn syrup


1 c. firmly packed light brown sugar

21/2 c. coarsely chopped pecans 9 inch unbaked pie shell

Preheat oven to 350° F. Combine corn syrup and sugar in 1 quart saucepan and stir over moderate heat until sugar is dissolved. Boil 2.3 minutes, remove from heat and stir in butter.

In large bowl beat eggs well, continue to beat while slowly pouring in syrup. Stir in vanilla and pecans. Pour into unbaked pie shell, bake 45-50 minutes or until filling has set.
