Foodstuffs won't prescribe any type of diet and they suggest reading up on what health foods might be best for you.

"It's been nice because I've met some of the people I used to do business with. They've come back to see me and help me," Mrs. Pomeroy said.

A Mary Kay Cosmetics sales representative for three years, Mrs. Pomeroy won't be giving that up. Her 600 make-up customers will just visit her in the shop to pick up their goods.

"Looking after your skin on a regular program is like nerobics and exercise programs... They kind of go together," she said.
