Halton NDP candidate Kevin Flynn felt that his leader Ed Broadbent did well in front of a nationally televised debate against the other party leaders.

"He did what every NDP was expecting him to," Mr. Flynn said in a positive tone.

He said the morale of his party workers is high and he feels quite confident about challenging incumbent PC Otto Jelinek and Liberal candidate Oriena Currie.

PC candidate says VIA will return to Acton

If the PC party wins the federal election you can expect the VIA rail service to once again make stops in Acton.

This announcement came from Halton PC candidate Otto Jelinek during the opening of the Acton campaign headquarters Thursday.

Through discussions with former Minister of Transportation, Don Mazankovski, who will be "probable" Minister of Transportation under Mr. Mulroney, it was decided that VIA rail stops which were discontinued in "numerous

communities" would be reinstated.

Apart from Acton, such communities include Banff, Jasper, and the Maritimes.

Mr. Jelinek said the Liberals cut the stops last November in what he called "one of the stupidest attempts" by the Liberals to cut costs.

The specifics of the reinstatement of the stops went all the way to Mr. Mulroney, he said.

"This is not a campaign promise, but something based on our concern from the beginning (of the cuts), Mr. Jelinek said.

Candidates favor liquor sales on election day

Question: Do you think alcoholic beverages should be sold in licensed premises during polling hours of federal elections?

Halton riding (Oakville and Acton)

Oriena Currie, Liberal candidate, told The Herald she thought the drinking laws were "a little archaic."

"I don't think anything should be forced to close for election day. It's just an injustice," she said. "If they close the bars, I think they should close everything else."

Otto Jelinek, Progressive-Conservative candidate, said small business and tourist operators are hurt whenever there's an election.

"Buying votes with alcohol doesn't exist any more. It's now hurting

the economy," Mr. Jelinek said.

Since 90 per cent of alcoholic beverages is taxed, it means a loss of revenue to both federal and provincial governments, and hence a loss of revenue to the taxpayer, he said.

Kevin Flynn, New Democratic Party candidate, said it didn't matter to him.

"I don't think bars should be penalized," he said. "It's hardly a priority issue for me."

Brampton-Georgetown riding (Brampton and Georgetown)

Ross Milne, Liberal candidate, said he had no strong feelings about the issue.

"It's more of an annoyance to people than anything else," he said about the bars having to close. "I would have no objection if the

It was an attempt to recoup the Conservative party's loss in the polls, he said.
