## Local student honored by architect judges

NORVAL—This past April turned out to be a month of better news and opportunities than Edgar Thatcher, son of Bruce and Vera Thatcher RR1 Norval, had expected.

In finishing his degree in landscape architecture at the University of Guelph, Edgar found himself nominated for two major awards specifically related to the study of landscape architecture. The first nomination was made to the student awards program for the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA).

The second was made to the Canadian Society of Landscape Architects. Both award judges selected Edgar for their "Certificate of Honor" for excellence in the field of landscape architecture studies.

The Canadian award provided some money and a book prize while the American Certificate of Honor made Edgar eligible for the ASLA student design competition.

Those students who had received the award, two from each of the 60 schools teaching landscape architecture across North America, could if they wished, enter an individually executed design project to the design competition for review.

The rules of the competition were quite general in that any work undertaken by the student over the past four years related to design could be "cleaned-up" and presented.

The entries had to be submitted on two presentation was a graphic and verbal explanation of Edgar's belief in the philosophical, artistic and practical similarities.

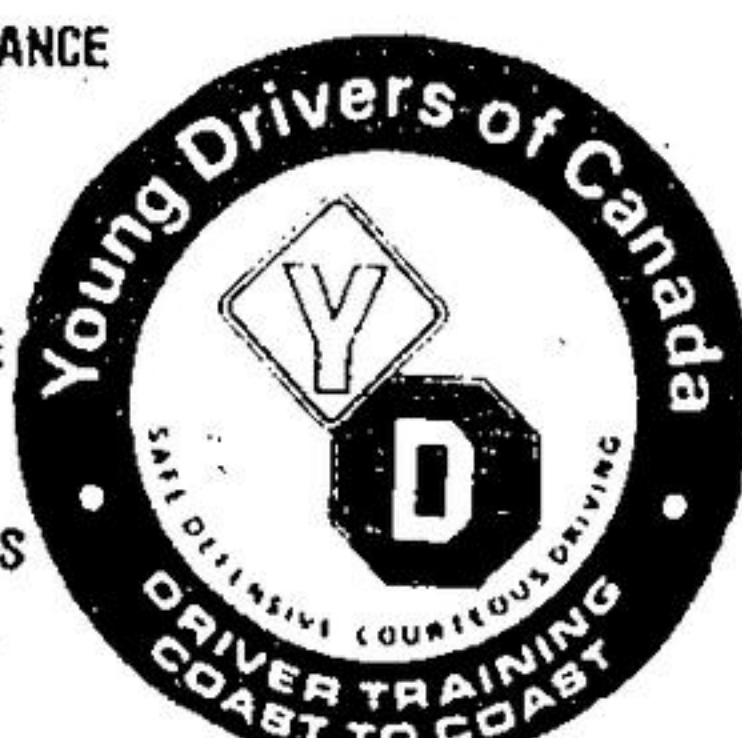
